- Theft reported from 16XXX Pilot Knob Road. The victim discovered multiple checks had been stolen, written out and cashed.

- Officers responded to a Theft in Progress at Fleet Farm. A 32-year old male was charged after stealing a \$100.00 Leatherman.
- Patrol responded to no less than three (3) Mental Health Crisis calls.
- Patrol responded to a Driving Complaint and located the suspect vehicle all over the road at Cedar Avenue and 190th. The driver, a 32-year old male, was found impaired, testing at a .28 BAC. He was arrested for 1st Degree DWI, Driving After Cancellation, Single Lane Violation, and Failure to Yield.
- Fraud Activity reported after an over-the-phone theft by swindle. The victim reported paying a representative from her previous mortgage company. She believed she was paying over \$800.00 to close her escrow account. However, the caller was not with the mortgage company.
- Theft reported from 8XXX 210th Street West. An unknown person(s) broke a window, entered and stole a television.
- Fraud Activity reported after the victim provided reloadable cash card numbers to an unknown person over-the-phone who was claiming to be a Dakota County Deputy.
